



## Better Pack® 555 UL Certification History

### UL Tested and Approved Since 1959

Underwriters Laboratories® (UL) has been the leading US product safety testing and certification organization since 1894. UL is an independent and not-for-profit organization.



The Better Pack 555 electric dispenser first received UL certification and was authorized to use the UL Mark when it was introduced in 1959. The product was initially tested and inspected via what is now called UL's Initial Product Inspection, or IPI, by UL engineers to ensure it met all of UL's safety requirements.

From that point forward, in order to retain the UL certification, the Better Pack 555 underwent Follow-Up Services Inspections, or FUS Inspections (typically unannounced) by a UL field representative at least four times per year. As part of this process, the UL field representative generates an Inspection Report, which fully documents the FUS Inspection and each product tested.

Better Packages has introduced different variations of the Better Pack 555 over the years. Any time an engineering improvement was made or a new model added, each one had to be tested and approved by UL. In 2000, the newly introduced electronic version of the Better Pack 555 was also UL tested and certified. Currently, seven Better Pack 555 electronic models are available, and all are UL certified. Since 1959, the Better Pack 555 series of dispensers has been in continuous compliance with UL's safety requirements.

### Better Packages Cares About Safety

All Better Pack 555 dispensers are engineered to ensure your packaging professionals and assets are protected. Safety features include UL approved motors, low voltage heaters and flame-retardant materials. A safety interlock switch disables the cutting mechanism when the cover of the dispenser is open, thus protecting your workers from moving blades when clearing the tape path or loading a new roll of tape. The Better Pack 555 is the only dispenser of its kind in the industry to be UL approved and certified.
